

House Antitrust Unit Asks I.B.M. for Industry Data

The International Business Machines Corporation confirmed yesterday that the House anti-trust subcommittee in Washington had asked for detailed information about the computer industry and markets.

The company said it had no comment on the letter or on the Congressional unit's plan to investigate the computer business.

Most of the country's other major computer manufacturers, including Control Data, Honeywell, Inc. and the General Electric Company, have also received letters from the House Committee. In January the Justice Department indicated that its antitrust division would investigate the computer industry.
